The 1st CNLU ONLINE BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY DEBATE was held between April

19-21, 2021. The tournament was the first edition of its kind but there wasn't any compromise on the prize money. It was kept as high as ever, amounting to Rs 55,000. This was an OPEN tournament and cross teams were allowed. The tournament had a separate novice category as well. Like previous editions of CNLU Parliamentary Debates, a brilliant Core Adjudication Panel comprising of Apratim, Bea B. Legaspi, Mozaein Tak and Jessica, its highlight along with several reputed Invited adjudicators.

The tournament was successfully conducted with the assistance of a plethora of highly diligent and responsible undertakings by the committee conveners and members, and was guided by the faculty in-charges.

British Parliamentary Sessions, An important development pushed forward by the ADC this year was to expand the culture of debating within CNLU—that earlier mostly focused on the Asian Parliamentary Debating format—by encouraging students to participate in British Parliamentary Debates (BPD). Prevention and Precaution.


