The Parliament always remains in news for the way people's representatives throw chairs, yell and shout at each other. But these students drawn from different institutions of the country enacted debates quite logically and peacefully. There were heated discussions, but no one used any abusive language.

The competition was organized by the Union ministry of parliamentary affairs with a view to instilling democratic values in the youth and making them aware about functioning of the Indian Parliament.

Debate spirit to fore at CNLU mock parliament

PATNA: The 13th National Youth Parliament Competition organised by ministry of parliamentary affairs at Chanakya National Law University (CNLU) attempted to mimic the real thing in Parliament of India, with students enacting the proceedings of Lok Sabha, on Tuesday.

The Youth Parliament was not at all like the real parliament of India as students discussed few important issues that are currently being discussed in the real Lok Sabha. But whatever they did, they did with full modesty, wit, content and discipline.

The issues they raised included the GST Bill, problem of drought and water scarcity in areas like Bundelkhand, issue of Chinese developing Gwadar port in Baluchistan to help Pakistan navy and sterilisation facility, among others.

They even mimicked or copied the dress which leaders wear: The role of the speaker was enacted by a girl in a sari and neatly tied hair that resembled former Lok Sabha speaker, Meira Kumar.

The mock session of Lok Sabha had powerful debates that had content and proper arguments and counter arguments that kept the audience glued to their seats till the session was concluded.

Many 'members' copied

accents and tone of few popular political leaders and delivered their speech even better: They thumped the table instead of hand clapping just like it happens in the real parliament. Copying the style of speaking with satire and poetic lines of a few politicians, some of them questioned and replied in the same manner. The mock session also had oath taking ceremony and foreign delegates marking the normal procedure in parliament.

While discussing his observation of the competition, Ram Kripal Yadav, union minister for drinking water and sanitation, said, "It was really interesting to see the roles well performed. The standard of debate was worth appreciating."

Talking about the GST bill, he said that everyone in parliament should keep aside politics and implement GST bill with few amendments to better regulate the markets to the benefit of consumers.

"Around 70% of rain water is wasted and it should be harvested. In the long run ponds and wells will vanish, an issue, which if of concern," he added.

Member of Parliament, Arun Kumar of Jehanabad constituency said the the debate was of high quality and had good content and the manner in which it was presented was far better than the real one.

Alok Mehta said that the projection of the mock session of parliament was performed

very well. "Earlier no one was of criminal background in the parliament from 1952, but now the situation is very different.

RP Singh Rahi appreciated the performance of students and advised them not to link education with livelihood, but with knowledge. Professor Arun Kumar, of CNLU said, "Earlier, the parliamentary sessions had debates with content and wit but today's scenario is completely changed. Peace in the house is generally lacking but today's mock session had it properly."

"Seeing the quality of language and debate, I felt that I am sitting in British parliament," he added.

Dinesh Arora of DAV College, Jalandhar said, "The purpose of youth parliament is not to imitate but to encourage students to know about parliament and its proceedings.

He informed that total 55 colleges have participated in the competition across the country and the competitions will be completed before September 15.
